

Situating Organisational Communication in Aotearoa New Zealand

The key objective underpinning this call for papers is to promote discussion around situated contexts for organisational communication research, scholarship, and teaching in Aotearoa New Zealand. We seek submissions from a variety of critical, interpretive, dialogic, and other perspectives including, but not limited to, papers which broaden thinking about what it means to research and practice communication in bicultural and multicultural contexts.

Papers might focus on:

- How is communication in a range of contexts; e.g., work, play, families, communities, unions, political parties, small businesses and corporations etc. shaped by our location in Aotearoa New Zealand?
- How does communication constitute bicultural or multicultural organisations and organising? For example, what organisational and workplace identities are possible in the context of efforts to strengthen bicultural and multicultural relations in Aotearoa New Zealand?
- What consequences flow for scholarship that examines organisational communication in various contexts in Aotearoa New Zealand, and/or what are the implications for organisational communication scholars of being based in Aotearoa New Zealand?
- What are the implications for teaching organisational communication in this locality?

We welcome papers that address additional questions that might be asked about organisational communication research, scholarship, and teaching in Aotearoa New Zealand, in multiple cultural, economic, geographic, historical, identity, institutional or social contexts.

Submissions must not have been published previously in journals or conference proceedings, or be currently under consideration by another publication.

The complete manuscript should be sent as a Word document file in an email attachment to Dr Alison Henderson and Dr Mary Simpson at the University of Waikato, on or before **15 June 2009**. Email: cjnz_special_ed@waikato.ac.nz.

Manuscripts must be formatted using the guidelines given at <http://www.nzca.org/journals.html> and should not exceed 7,500 words (including references, figures and tables).
